Hisar School was founded in 1996 by Hisar Educational Foundation, a non-profit organization committed to providing an exemplary academic education to the youth of Turkey starting at the preschool level. Over the brief span of 24 years, Hisar has become one of the best educational institutions in the country and continues to develop global leaders of the future in Turkey and in the world. Hisar's mission is discovering and developing our true potential through critical thinking, effective collaboration and meaningful contributions as world citizens with the integration of 21st century skills into the curriculum.

HIGH SCHOOL FACULTY

The faculty is comprised of 85 teachers. Of these, 16% are foreign nationals and 56% hold advanced degrees.

COVID-19 UPDATES

In line with the statements and guidelines of the Ministry of Health and Ministry of National Education, 2021-2022 Academic Year started with face-to-face education at all levels on Monday, September 6, 2021.

Our campus and curriculum for the new school year have been prepared with an emphasis on the health and safety of our community. GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS & CURRICULUM

The academic program is bilingual with a university preparatory curriculum. English is the language of instruction for science, mathematics and English literature courses as well as a variety of electives. Turkish is the language of instruction for Turkish language and literature and some social science courses.

Students follow a common core curriculum as mandated by the Turkish Ministry of Education, consisting of English, Turkish literature and language, mathematics, sciences, social sciences, a foreign language, and electives. It is expected that students planning to study science, mathematics, or engineering complete 4 years of mathematics, 3 sciences in grades 9-10 and 2 sciences in grades 11-12. Students take an average of 12 courses per year, including electives. To graduate, students must complete a minimum of 40 credits per year. All students graduating from Hisar are awarded the Anadolu Lisesi Diploması (Private Anatolian High School Diploma).

ACADEMIC & ADVISING POLICIES

Hisar School does not compute class rank. Both year-end averages and cumulative GPAs are listed on the transcript. GPAs are calculated by multiplying grades by the number of credit hours in each course. All courses are included in the cumulative GPA average. We do not incorporate transfer grades from other institutions in our GPA. AP courses are not weighted and graded on the same scale as other courses.

It is important to note that grade inflation is not practiced at Hisar. Admission is selective and our academic standards are high. In the class of 2021, the top GPA was 97.82 and the year before that it was 97.64. Students receive numeric grades on a 100 point scale in all courses. **Hisar's passing grade is 60**.

In cases where universities require or request, Hisar School reports all out-of-school suspensions, exclusions and withdrawals that arise as a result of a disciplinary incident where the incident raises significant concerns about the future safety and well-being of the student concerned or of those with whom he/she interacts; or where the incident raises significant concerns about the academic integrity of the student.



ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP) COURSES


Traditionally the Turkish Curriculum is known for its rigor, especially in mathematics and sciences. In addition to the Turkish Curriculum, AP courses are offered to 11th and 12th grade students only as elective courses. Hisar School began implementing the program in 2007 (only 2 courses offered), and **currently offers the highest number of AP courses in Turkey.** There are 21 AP courses being offered in 2021-2022 and 70% of 11th and 12th grade students are enrolled in AP courses.

As a result of course-scheduling conflicts with the Turkish Ministry requirements, some of our students not enrolled in the courses study independently and sit for the AP exams. In 2021, a total of 366 AP exams were administered in 21 AP subjects.

In 2014-2015 Hisar School was selected as one of 16 international schools to pilot the AP Capstone Diploma Program. This innovative diploma program provides students the opportunity to engage in scholarly practice of the core academic skills through a two-course sequence: AP Seminar in grade 11 and AP Research in grade 12. Successful completion of these two courses earns an AP certificate. Successful completion of these two courses earns an AP Capstone Diploma.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS & EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Despite the ongoing pandemic process, our students both organized and participated in a wide range of online activities. Students attended events in which they demonstrated their negotiation skills. Students presented in the 53rd THIMUN conference with nearly 2000 students from all over the world. Celebrating its 15th anniversary, our students organized the International JMUN conference in March 2021 with the theme of "Combating Polarization in Times of Global Crisis". Students also took the role of "instructor" by holding various workshops in the online "Innovation Summit" organized by American Community Schools in Greece. Students gave training on programming with Sonic Pi, website programming techniques, python programming with PyGame, and image processing techniques with OpenCV.

Our students started new events and organized the "Women In Science Conference" at the national level, and GameJam – Game Development Contest at the international level. Also, the 3rd PiWars Turkey Robotics Competition and the 7th Hisar Coding Summit were successfuly organized in online platforms by our students. Throughout the summit which included prestigious guest speakers from institutions such as Google, Microsoft and Stanford, various topics that shed light on the future such as entrepreneurship in technology, use of artificial intelligence, technology-human interaction and artificial intelligence in biology were discussed in detail.

Hisar students also won unique awards this year. While one student from Grade 11 received the "Outstanding Instructor" award given by the Middle East/North African Writing Center Association MENAWCA, the article of our 12th grade student was seleceted by the jury of Harvard GlobalWE (Harvard's Women's Empowerment Essay Contest).

In April and May, three research projects prepared by our Grade 10 and 11 students were entitled to be published in the "Open Schools Journal for Open Science". We celebrated the release of the second book study: "S.T.E.A.M. Punks". The book was published in collaboration with Columbia University Student Press, and was a collection of Hisar High School students' original writing, interviews, essays and visual art works in the STEAM field.
