


### TIME IN THE CENTER

We have increased the hours of one-on-one sessions in our center every year. As the chart below shows, more writers are spending more time with us.



### **FULL SPEED AHEAD**

Apart from individual students seeking writing help, we have also seen significant increases in every other aspect of what we do. We have **consulted** with more departments and teachers, given and developed more **workshops** for students as well as faculty, and extended our **global reach** in the community of writing centers by building our social media presence, personal connections, and **publication**.



### **GLOBAL REACH**

We are the first and only student-staffed high school writing center in Turkey and one of the very few in the greater surrounding regions.

This puts us in a unique position to be a school of interest and influence on the global stage.

## GLOBAL ENGAGEMENT

4 of our student consultants attended a 2-day international writing center conference hosted by the SSWCA. Our students were able to participate in 15 different peer presentations and workshops.

Through this conference, we formed a local partnership with new writing centers in **Greece** and **Holland** which will be developed and expanded next year.

We have received 3 nominations to be representatives in the International Writing Centers Association - two peer nominations and one staff.



### **PUBLICATION**

We published our third book with Columbia University's Student Press Initiative. It contains 70 pieces of writing and 15 pieces of visual art from high school students.

The idea behind *Versus* is juxtaposition, conflict, and how things relate and interact. As our previous two books have been, this book was open to submissions from the entire high school, but we worked closely with several departments on specific chapters, including **Art, Physical Education, Turkish, Creative Writing, AP Economics,** and **11th grade AP English.** 

This book is evidence of the rich and growing culture of writing at Hisar.

### **PUBLICATION (CONTINUED)**



We had an article published in The International Educator.



Tom Fox, the director of The National Writing Project, toured our center, met with our consultants, and observed live sessions. He wrote about his experience and how impressed he was with our center and organization. The NWP works with thousands of schools across the United States in over 2,000 school districts.

# STUDENT WORKSHOPS

We created several writing workshops designed to address areas of need identified by our College Counseling department.

This year's workshops:

The high school English department reported that students no longer need to come to them for help with their college application essays thanks to our help.

We developed targeted and engaging workshops, and in coordination with the teachers, crashed their classrooms with surprise workshops.

# FACULTY WORKSHOPS

Every year faculty reach out to us for help with specific writing-related needs. This year we developed workshops for 4 different departments:

**Social Studies: Opinion and Counter Arguments** 

French: Creative Writing Course Design

**English: Feedback for Writing** 

Preschool: Children's Book Writing

Working with the Preschool department has been especially rewarding. Their goal is to write and publish their own children's books that will highlight the Hisar values. So far, they have written 4 wonderful stories!

### **AUDIO / VISUAL**

#### **Columbia University CPET Teacher Academy**

We advised Columbia University educators on how to plan and develop a training course to address Hisar's specific writing needs. We also created a series of video lessons for them to use in the Write to Learn online course.

#### **PSAT Writing Prep Course**

We created a YouTube channel and a series of video lessons about writing for the PSAT.

#### **Commercials and Training**

With the help of the Hisar Cultural Center, we produced commercials for our center as well as training videos for future writing consultants.
