DEFINITIONS AND CRITERIA FOR OTHER AWARDS

ECIS International Understanding Award

An 11th Grade student, who acts positively towards the lives and cultures of others, makes a positive contribution to school life, has the skill to bring different people together in a sense of community, so that he/she can further promote international peace and cooperation, is awarded the ECIS International Understanding Award in each academic year.

The reward for the award: The student who is granted the award is given a certificate prepared by ECIS.

Selection method: He/she is selected based on the following criteria by the Board of High School Department Heads from among the nominated 11th Class students.

Award Criteria:

- a) He/she adopts and protects the education and training values, principles and rules of the school.
- b) He/she is loved and respected by his/her circle.
- c) He/she is a good role model.
- d) His/her behavior and attitude are coherent inside and outside the school.
- e) He/she represents his/her school and country well.
- f) He/she acts positively towards the lives and cultures of others.
- g) He/she speaks at least two languages.
- h) He/she has positive contributions to school life.
- i) He/she has the ability to bring different people together in a sense of community.
- j) He/she has the ability and desire to further promote international peace and cooperation.
- k) The award is granted to a 11th Grade student whose contributions and work have been observed since 9th Grade.

Feyyaz Berker Sportsmanship Award

A 7th Grade and an 11th Grade student, who have made a great contribution to social, cultural, sporting, and academic life at school and/or shown exemplary behavior, who have adopted and embraced ethical behavior in their lives, are awarded the Sportsmanship Award in each academic year.

Award Criteria:

a) An "exemplary person" is someone we strive to become. He/she is not defined by qualifications with strict limits, grade point averages or exam results. We grant this award to a person who has a lifestyle that is in compliance with the standards of the exemplary person.

"The True Gentleman (The Exemplary Person) is the man whose conduct proceeds from goodwill and an acute sense of propriety, and whose self-control is equal to all emergencies; who does not make the poor man conscious of his poverty, the obscure man of his obscurity, or any man of his inferiority or deformity; who is himself humbled if necessity compels him to humble another; who does not flatter wealth, cringe before power, or boast of his own possessions or achievements; who speaks with frankness but always with sincerity and sympathy; whose deed follows his word; who thinks of

the rights and feelings of others, rather than his own; and who appears well in any company, a man with whom honor is sacred and virtue safe." John Walter Wayland

- b) A candidate is nominated for the Feyyaz Berker Award every year from among the students of Hisar Schools.
- c) Academic success is not a criterion for nomination, but nominated students must have passed their classes directly.
- d) Candidates must not have received any disciplinary penalties.
- e) Candidates must have personal integrity and maturity.
- f) They exhibit high standards in their behavior.
- g) They make contributions to society without any expectations.
- h) Their sense of social responsibility is strong.
- i) They have a positive school spirit.
- j) They have positive qualities in their characters, such as self-control, courage, fairness and stable behavior.
- k) They are loved and respected within the school community.
- I) He/she is a student who protects and cares for other students and presents a good role model for them.
