




TIME IN THE CENTER

Many tutors returned to our program this year to take our advanced elective course. That, along with an increase in total tutors from 24 to 42 has allowed our center to spend more time working with writers. An average appointment is 20 minutes long. You can see the significant increase in hours of individual sessions from our first year of operation.



Apart from individual students seeking writing help, our center was used for many other purposes. Faculty came over for consultation, students were trained to be tutors, and various workshops were given.





PUBLICATION

This year, we began working with Columbia University Student Press Initiative from the beginning of the school year, which is a half-aschool-year earlier than last year.
