



HISAR SCHOOL EARTHQUAKE PREPAREDNESS ACTIVITIES: LOGISTICS INVENTORY



As Hisar School, we previously informed you that we have been carrying out our earthquake preparedness activities in collaboration with the Akut Foundation for the last 3 years with the determination to provide the safest environment for our students. Within this scope, we established the Hisar Schools Emergency Management (EMM) Team.

We continue to share our course of action plans for disaster preparedness, effective response and evacuation, which we have re-evaluated and updated following the Kahramanmaraş-based earthquakes on February 6, 2023.

Since communication, health services, and equipment supply are vitally important, planning, preparation, and supervision are meticulously carried out at Hisar Schools to avoid any setbacks in these phases.

We draw to your attention detailed information on the material inventories that are available to provide first interventions in case of emergencies and to meet the basic needs of our students and staff on our campus for 72 hours.

We believe that all our staff, students and parents being informed about these preparations and planning prior to a possible disaster will positively affect the processes to be carried out during a disaster. We kindly request you carefully review the brief information provided below with our students. Thank you for your collaboration.

EMERGENCY MATERIAL LIST

After a destructive earthquake or other disaster that may occur while education is in session, depending on the damage caused by the earthquake to the environment and the school, staff and students may have to stay at the school after the disaster. Therefore, considering the possibility of students and staff to stay at the school for at least 72 hours after a disaster, water and food, medical supplies, various tools and equipment, and enough blankets for warmth according to the season have been identified and stored. Also, in case of structural problems in school buildings, tents of various sizes were provided for shelter.

First Response: In our school, there are **7 Emergency cabinets**, one in the EM center and others in the assembly areas, where various materials to be used for the first response is kept to ensure the health and security of our students and staff in case of any emergency.

72-Hour Sheltering: In case our students and staff stay at school longer than expected, the basic needs provided below have been stored and their lists have been recorded at the EM center. Materials are stored in the Earthquake Shed in our school garden, which is one of the most easily accessible and least likely to be structurally damaged.

In addition, the food and medical supplies stored are monitored at regular intervals and replaced with new ones according to their expiration dates, and the procedures and replacement dates are recorded. We draw your attention to the list of materials available in our Emergency Storage Rooms below.
